



Greenfield Primary School Pupil Premium Strategy 2016-2017



Financial Year	Pupil Premium Allocation
2016 to 2017	£24,120

In the 2016 to 2017 financial year, schools will receive the following funding for each child registered as eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years:

£1,320 for pupils in Reception to Year 6

£935 for pupils in Year 7 to Year 11

Schools will also receive £1,900 for each pupil identified in the Spring school census as having left local-authority care because of 1 of the following reasons:

- adoption
- a special guardianship order
- a child arrangements order
- a residence order

If a pupil has been registered as eligible for free school meals and has also left local-authority care for any of the reasons above, they will attract the £1,900 rate. Children who have been in local-authority care for 1 day or more also attract £1,900 of pupil premium funding. Funding for these pupils is managed by the virtual school head in the local authority that looks after the child.

Ofsted and the government expect this money to be used to close the gap in attainment between disadvantaged pupils and their peers nationally. Although the funding is used to meet the needs of these individuals, other pupils may benefit from it as a matter of course, eg from increased staffing.

Barriers to achievement at Greenfield

- Number of children with additional learning and behavioural needs
- Children's resilience and ability to engage in all kinds of learning
- Engagement of parents and carers in supporting children's learning and wider outcomes
- Attendance and punctuality

How Pupil Premium will be used to address these barriers

In the 2016-2017 we plan to use Pupil Premium at Greenfield to support pupils in the following ways:

Use of Good Morning & Good Afternoon Club	£1053
Extra-curricular provision – music tuition	£408
Additional 1:1 weekly reading sessions in Key Stage 1	£1,100
