The pupil premium is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England. Ofsted and the government expect this money to be used to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils of all abilities and to close the gaps between them and their peers. Although the funding is used to meet the needs of these individuals, other pupils may benefit from it as a matter of course, eg from increased staffing.

Barriers to achievement at Greenfield

- Disproportionately high number of children with additional learning and behavioural needs
- Children's resilience and ability to engage in all kinds of learning
- Engagement of parents and carers in supporting children's learning and wider outcomes
- Attendance and punctuality

How Pupil Premium will be used to address these barriers

In the 2017-2018 we plan to use Pupil Premium at Greenfield to support pupils in the following ways:

Priority One - Securing success for all children	
Additional teacher for Maths ability sets from Year 1 to Year 6	£8,490
Additional teaching assistant in Reception (EYFS)	£15,202
Support from Learning Support Service - 40.5 units	£3,378
Support from Educational Psychologist	£5,400

Priority Two - Supporting pupils' well-being and behaviour	
Restorative Approaches with Peacemakers	£800
Learning Support Mentor (social groups, 1:1 IEP work, mentoring, additional tuition, Emotional, Well-being, Mindfulness & Resilience Groups)	£19,165

Priority Three - Ensuring equality of access to the curriculum	
Subsidised educational visits and residentials	£200
Use of Good Morning & Good Afternoon Club	£1053
Extra-curricular provision – music tuition	£408
Additional 1:1 weekly reading sessions in Key Stage 1	£1,100

Priority Four - Supporting parents and carers to engage in their child's education	
Release time for Structured Conversations	£3,600
Morning 'Meet and Greet' session	LSM time Teacher time
Open Sessions – targeted invitation	
Parental support

Half termly internal assessment of children's progress in Reading, Writing, & Maths followed up by 1 to 1 mentoring
 Statutory assessment data
 Parental feedback & questionnaire
 Structured Conversation feedback from children and parents
 Individual observations of learning
