



## Islam Knowledge Organiser - Lower Key Stage 2

<b>Vocabulary</b>	
<b>Adam</b>	The first man- and the first prophet.
<b>al-Hikmah</b>	The belief that the Qur'an was not just revealed to Muhammad, but that he was given the wisdom to understand and interpret it.
<b>Arabia</b>	The country in which prophet Muhammad was born and where the faith of Islam began.
<b>idol</b>	A painting or statue of a god to be used as an object of worship. In Islam idols are forbidden as they could lead to the worship of the idol rather than God.
<b>image</b>	A copy or imitation of an object or person or creature. Avoided by Muslims for the same reasons as idols.
<b>infallible</b>	Muslims believe the Qur'an to be without fault-free from any human error.
<b>inspiration</b>	An idea that comes to a person's mind. This is different from revelation which comes directly from God.
<b>monotheism</b>	The belief in one God.
<b>Seal of the Prophets</b>	The name given to prophet Muhammad. The last of the prophets.
<b>Shahadah</b>	The first of the five pillars of Islam. The declaration of faith. There is no God but Allah and Muhammad is the prophet of Allah.

**Muslim beliefs about God:** *These beliefs are also part of Christianity and Judaism.*

There is one God (Allah).

God is loving and forgiving.

God is all powerful- omnipotent.

God has no fixed shape or form and is a spiritual being.

**Muslim beliefs about Muhammad:**

Muhammad was born in Makkah about 550 years after Jesus died.

Muhammad was a human being, not God, and not related to God or an angel.

Muhammad is known as "the seal of the Prophets".

Muslims believe that the Qur'an was revealed to Muhammad by God. Muslims believe that the Qur'an contains God's words, not those of a human author.

**Muslim belief about the Qur'an**

The Qur'an names 25 prophets, beginning with Adam and ending with Muhammad (including Abraham, Moses and Jesus).
