Key Words	
agape	The Greek word used in the New Testament for 'unconditional love', showing kindness to another person but not requiring kindness in return.
Christian love	As above.
"Love your enemies"	Words used by Jesus to teach his followers the idea of Christian love.
Bible	The Christian Holy Book
parable	A story used to illustrate a moral or spiritual lesson. Jesus told parables in the Gospels (New Testament).
"Treat others as you want to be treated"	Jesus' words to explain living a good life. The Golden Rule

The 5 Pillars of Islam: The 5 K's of Sikhism:

Shahadah - Declaration of faith. **Kanga** - a special comb which represents cleanliness.

Salat - Daily prayers **Kesh** - uncut hair which represents power.

Zakat - Giving to charity **Kara** - a steel bangle which represents unity.

Saum - Fasting during Ramadan **Kirpan** - a sword which represents respect and justice.

Hajj - Making the Pilgrimage to Mecca **Kachera** - special shorts which represent modesty.

The story of The Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37)

- 1. A man is beaten and left by the roadside on his journey from Jericho to Jerusalem.
- 2. Important people from Jerusalem pass him and do not offer any help. They cross over the road and ignore the wounded man.
- 3. The Samaritan- a man from Samaria, stops to help the man. He bandages his wounds and takes him to an inn and pays for him to be cared for.

The story of the Good Samaritan can be found in the Gospel of Luke in the New Testament of the Bible.

Jesus told the story to his followers to show them that they should always be willing to help other people.

The Samaritan and the man from Jerusalem would have usually considered themselves to be enemies.

The Samaritan was putting his own life at risk by stopping to help the beaten man.

The Samaritan had no reasonable hope or expectation that the man would ever show kindness or help him in the future.

This help is an illustration of unconditional love and humanity.
