## LiteracyMathematicsThe children will build on their phonic knowledge of shortThis term the children will deepen their understanding of

and long vowel sounds, while learning to blend adjacent consonants at the beginning and end of words. In our daily phonics lessons, they will blend and segment sounds in longer words with suffixes, along with learning 18 new tricky words. The children read within a group, three times a week to develop their fluency, expression, and comprehension. They also apply their phonic knowledge to spell and write words. The children will be encouraged to write their own simple sentences using full stops, capital letters and finger spaces.

# numbers, consolidating key skills, including subitising, counting, composition, sorting and matching and comparing and ordering. We will be exploring numbers beyond 10, thinking about building numbers and counting patterns. The children will use number shapes, 10 frames and beads strings to support them. The children will also look at adding more and taking away. We will also be exploring doubling, sharing and grouping as well as the concept of odd and even. The children will develop their spatial reasoning, while they learn about shapes, pattern and positional language.

# Understanding the World We will continue to explore seasonal changes as the children look for signs of summer in our outdoor area. The children will learn more about healthy foods and where foods come from, as well as about the beach and animal habitats. We have a butterfly garden and will explore the life cycle process. We are visiting Little Owl Farm to learn all about the different farm animals – we will encourage the children to ask lots of questions. We will look at the foods we get from farm animals too. This term we will also

# Expressive Art and Design The children will continue to use a variety of materials, tools and techniques as they design, make and create in their play. Children will be introduced to Pointillism and the children will attempt to paint in the style of Georges Seurat with cotton buds. They will focus on use of brushes and colours to paint background and landscapes. The children will continue to explore clay and also Plastercine by creating farm inspired sculptures. The children will practise retelling familiar stories in sequence

find out about monarchs (Queen Elizabeth II and King Charles III) and begin to understand why some people from the past are important today. We will compare the countryside to towns and cities and look at world maps. We will continue to build the children's awareness of special occasions from different religions such as baptisms, weddings, Eid and Passover. We will look at stories from special religious books such as the Bible and the Qur'an. Finally, the children will be using our computer suite for the first time and will be learning how to use technology safely.

using props. They will start to develop their own narratives with their peers as they role play. The children will continue to enjoy imaginative play in a range of role play areas, including a Farm Shop. They can express themselves through shared songs related to farmyards and the summertime.

#### Things to Do at Home

**Sound Packs;** we will continue to add new tricky words to your child's sound pack each week. Please look at the sounds and make words using the word lists suggested on Class Dojo. Each week, we will share the focus of our phonics lessons on Class Dojo with a few sentences for you to practise at home with your children.
